Reading is the first step to opening our children to a new world of experiences. We created two main literacy pillars of learning for the 2024-25 school year: a new robust writing curriculum and reading support for students who may need additional help. We have also implemented a new enrichment spot in our day for students who need extra challenges for their learning.

At the start of our school year, 60% of our students (29 of 46) in grades K-6 were reading at benchmark, according to Acadience, a reading tool we use to check our ability. Before Christmas, that number increased to 76% (35 of 46). Based on the reading checks at the end of February, if reading continues to be successful, 89% (40 of 45) students should hit their reading goals by the end of the year. If programming growth trends stay true, by the end of 2025-26, we should have 97% of our students reading above the national average. We also have a strong pre-kindergarten program that sets students up for success, allowing our next year's kindergarten students to have higher mastery of language than their peers.

Nebraska created a new goal: the Nebraska Literacy Project aims to have 75% of all students reading at benchmark by the end of 3rd grade in 2030. By Christmas 2024, we had already achieved the goal. Our achievement should easily surpass expectations and be higher than those of our regionally comparable schools. We must keep reading, writing, and conversation at the front of instruction; literacy is the cornerstone of a classical education.



Artist in Residence 2025

During all the activities in February, auctions, penny wars, and donations, the staff had decided to work with the Nebraska Arts Council to hire an artist in residence in the spring. Final decisions for our artist are being made soon. We have selected visual arts as the target of projects, giving each student the opportunity to be taught by, work with, and create art from a master in the skill.

A classical model of education shares a love of beauty. God's creation is a wonder to observe. Man's interpretation of beauty in the visual arts can give us peace and a lifetime of joy. We are thankful to those who donated to the project, and we look forward to sharing more information once the dates are set.



LB 624 and Legislation

LB 624, similar to LB 1402, would allow the state to give ten million dollars to private and parochial schools for students in the highest need. Four students received scholarships this school year, and they made a significant impact on their families.
